

Johnson County Hires Steve Rosendahl, Nuisance Officer

This new position shifts the responsibility for enforcement and investigation to the State's Attorney's office from the Sheriff's Department. The final ordinance defines a variety of nuisances which fall broadly into: general nuisances, weeds, and dangerous building. Each of these categories grant slightly different procedures for abatement, or removal/remediation, of the nuisance. Dangerous buildings, for example, allow for a longer period of time to correct than an overgrown lawn.

The Johnson County Ordinance Officer/State's Attorney Investigator will refer documented nuisances to the State's Attorney. The State's Attorney, or another representative of the Johnson County Board of Commissioners, will then serve a notice to the property owner or occupant regarding the nuisance. This Notice to Abate, or remove/correct the nuisance, will require the nuisance in question be addressed in no less than 30 days. If not corrected in this time period, the property owner or occupant can be fined, with the fine increasing with subsequent offenses if the nuisance is not corrected. Monthly Food Pantry

The EPBA Safety and Environment committee is working with the Salvation Army of Southern Illinois in Marion to deliver pantry to the association building for members in need. Please contact Peggy Griffith at 618-996-2847 and provide your last name and how many are in your household.

The pantry aims to provide food and resources to local families in need. The Salvation Army of Southern Illinois in Marion hosts a market in Marion on the first Monday of every month. For those that are able, drivers line up early to receive fruits, vegetables and pantry staples. Volunteers load the boxes and bags in each vehicle. The next market in Marion will be Monday, April 5th.

The information requested is for verification of the number of families served so the appropriate resources can be allocated, as requested by the Salvation Army. Instructions regarding pick-up will be given when you call.
